
The Patriots had the ball as the clock ticked down. Quarterback Tom Brady dropped back to pass. Could he set up his team for the winning score?



Tom Brady (#12) reacts happily to a first down during Super Bowl XXXVIII (38).








A Late Start


Tom Brady didn't play much football as a child. His parents wouldn't let him. They worried he might get hurt.
