In a bamboo forest, there is a small cave.

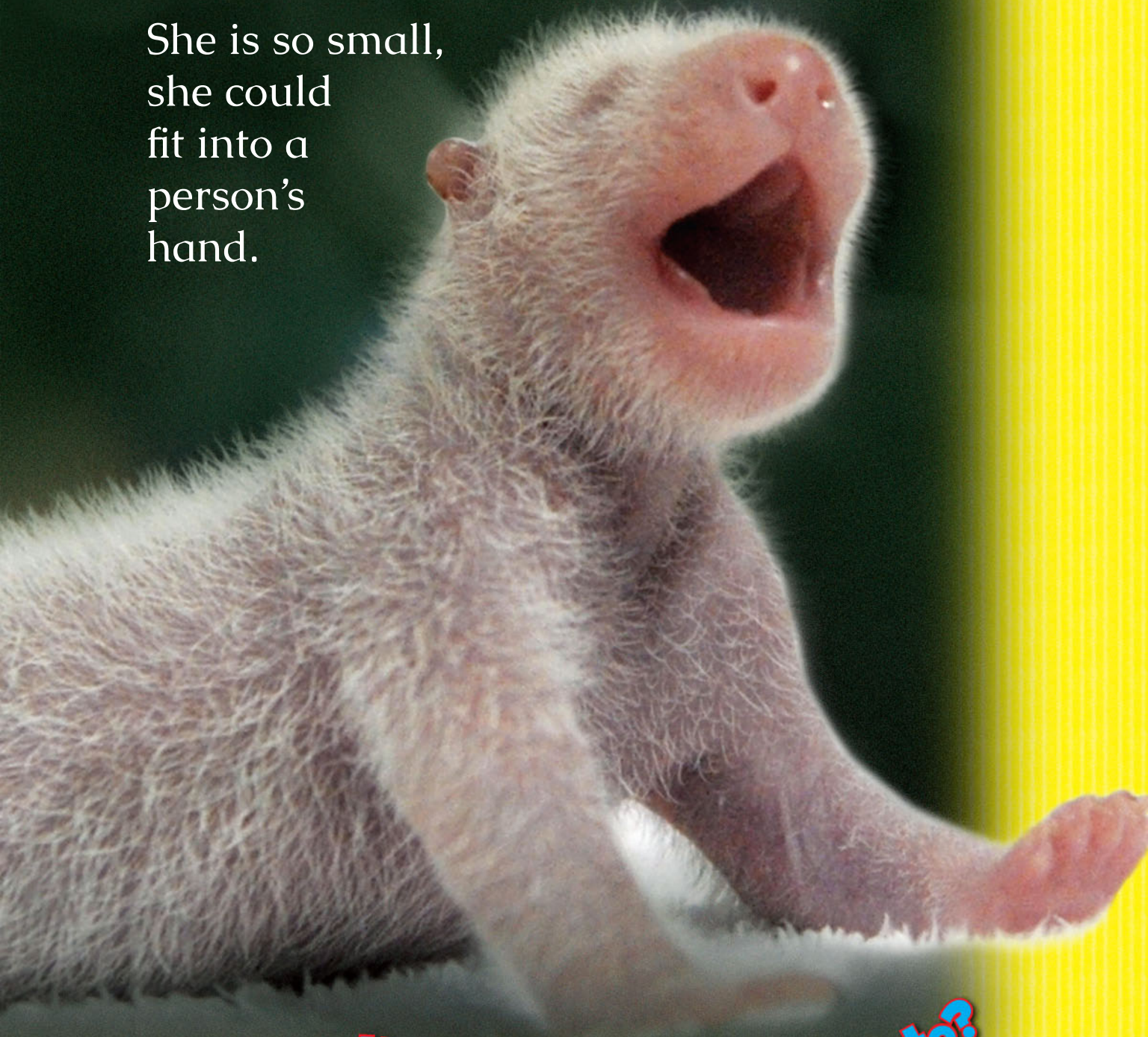


Den

territory (TER-uh-tor-ee)

An area where an animal lives and finds its food. An animal might try to defend its territory from rivals to protect its food.
